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| 1 | Teach someone | Teach someone in your family. You can choose what topic you teach them – pets in German, how adjectives work, the perfect tense, greetings. The choice is yours. Come up with your own teaching materials, and why not video the lesson and give them a test at the end of the lesson. You could teach someone who doesn't live in your house via zoom, facetime or teams. |
| 2 | Poetry please | Read through the PowerPoints and worksheets and have a go at writing a variety of poems in French or German. |
| 3 | Read all about it | Read a news story in German or French. Look up any new vocabulary and write a brief summary in English about what the item of news was about. Useful links are... French news German news |
| 4 | Same and different | What similarities are there between the language you are learning and English? Do you speak another language at home? How is that similar and/or different to French/German? This could include vocabulary, grammar rules, word order etc. Write a 'Top 10 similarities and differences between...' |
| 5 | How to... | Write a 'how to...' guide for teachers or parents. This could be – how to send a voice recording via email; how to add accents to a document; how to use an interactive whiteboard; what the function keys do. Make it as simple as possible to follow and you can include pictures/step-by-step instructions. |
| 6 | Be creative | Use https://storybird.com/ to write your own story. You need to join, but has loads of great pictures to create your own story book. |
